- A copy of your high school diploma or your final official high school transcript that shows the date when the diploma was awarded
- A copy of the your DD Form 214 Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty that indicates you are a high school graduate or equivalent
- A copy of your GED (General Educational Development certificate) or GED transcript or a Certification of a passing score on a test that your state authorizes and recognizes as the equivalent of a high school diploma. This includes tests similar to the GED, such as the High School Equivalency Test or the Test Assessing Secondary Completion.
- A copy of the “secondary school leaving certificate” or similar document, obtained from the appropriate government agency, for students who completed secondary school in a foreign country. If your college does not have the expertise to evaluate foreign secondary school credentials or chooses not to do so, there are evaluation services available - please submit documentation from such a service.
- An academic transcript that indicates you have successfully completed at least a 2-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor’s degree
- If State law requires a homeschooled student to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschool (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), provide a copy of that credential for yourself.
- If State law does not require a homeschooled student to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschool (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a transcript or the equivalent, signed by your parent or guardian, that lists the secondary school courses you completed and documents the successful completion of a secondary school education in a homeschool setting.
- If you do not qualify for any of the above options, you may be permitted to receive Title IV funds by completing an ATB alternative examination with a passing score. If you fit this criteria, **please have your school FAO submit a completed Ability-to-Benefit Alternatives Eligibility Affirmation Form, which can be found on the VFAO website, along with ATB test results.**
